

COUNCIL-ADMINISTRATOR FORM OF GOVERNMENT FOR FLORENCE COUNTY

Designating Sources Of Payment Of Grant Funds By Florence County Relative To The Respective Economic Development Projects Of H.J. Heinz Company And Monster Worldwide, Inc. In An Aggregate Amount Not To Exceed Two Million Four Hundred Seventy-Five Thousand Dollars And Expressing The Intent Of Florence County Council That Florence County Reimburse Itself For Such Payments From The Proceeds Of Special Source Revenue Bonds Of Florence County.

WHEREAS,

- Florence County, South Carolina (the "County"), acting by and through its County Council 1. (the "County Council") is authorized and empowered under and pursuant to the provisions of Title 4, Chapter 12, Code of Laws of South Carolina 1976, as amended (the "Act"), to accept the conveyance of land, a building or buildings, machinery and equipment and other assets which together constitute a "project" as defined in the Act, and to enter into lease agreements with any industry for such project which requires the industry to make a payment of a fee-in-lieu of taxes ("FILOT"), or, alternatively, the County Council is empowered to enter into a Fee Agreement (the "Simplified FILOT") with respect to a project pursuant to Title 12, Chapter 44 of the Code of Laws of South Carolina 1976 (the "Code"), as amended (the "Fee In Lieu of Tax Simplification Act") which requires the industry to make a payment of a fee in lieu of taxes without the conveyance of title to the County, through which powers (whether under the Act or the Fee in Lieu of Tax Simplification Act) the industrial development of the State of South Carolina and the County will be promoted and trade developed by inducing manufacturing and commercial enterprises to locate and remain in the State of South Carolina and the County and thus to utilize and employ the manpower, products, and natural resources of the State of South Carolina to benefit the general public welfare of the County by providing services, employment, and other public benefits not otherwise provided locally; and
- 2. The County is authorized and empowered to expend monies in the furtherance of industrial and other economic development projects which will benefit the general welfare of the County, either through the expenditure of funds appropriated for such purpose or the proceeds of Bonds issued by the County pursuant to Chapter 29 of Title 4 of the Code ("Special Source Bonds"), or the granting of Special Source Revenue Tax Credits pursuant to Chapter 44 of Title 12 of the Code ("Special Source Credits"); and

- 3. The County has heretofore entered into Simplified FILOT agreements and other incentive agreements (together, the "Incentive Agreements") with each of: (1) H.J. Heinz Company ("Heinz") with respect to the investment by Heinz of approximately One Hundred Five Million Dollars (\$105,000,000) in the County for the purpose of acquiring, constructing, and equipping a food production facility in the County (the "Heinz Facility"), which Heinz Facility will create approximately 350 new, full-time jobs; and (2) Monster Worldwide, Inc. ("Monster") with respect to the investment by Monster of approximately Twenty-Eight Million Dollars (\$28,000,000) in the County for the purpose of acquiring, constructing, and equipping a customer service facility in the County (the "Monster Facility"), which Monster Facility will create approximately 750 new, full-time jobs; and
- 4. Pursuant to the Incentive Agreements, the County has agreed to provide cash grants to Heinz and Monster for the purchase of real property to be used in the Heinz and Monster Facilities in the following amounts: (1) \$2,000,000 to Heinz; and (2) \$475,000 to Monster, which grants will be paid: (a) from available funds of the County to be reimbursed from the proceeds of Special Source Bonds of the County, payable from FILOT payments from Heinz and Monster, to be issued not later than twelve (12) months after the payment by the County of such grant monies or from such FILOT payments; (b) the proceeds of such Special Source Bonds; or (c) Special Source Credits, all as shall be agreed to between the County and each of Heinz and Monster.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by Florence County Council as follows:

Section 1. The cash grant of Two Million Dollars (\$2,000,000) for land acquisition with respect to the Heinz Facility shall be paid: (a) from available funds of the County to be reimbursed from the proceeds of Special Source Bonds of the County, payable from FILOT payments with respect to the Heinz Facility, to be issued not later than twelve (12) months after the payment by the County of such grant monies or from such FILOT payments; (b) the proceeds of such Special Source Bonds; or (c) Special Source Credits, all as shall be agreed to between the County and Heinz.

Section 2. The cash grant of Four Hundred Seventy-Five Thousand Dollars (\$475,000) for land acquisition with respect to the Monster Facility shall be paid: (a) from available funds of the County to be reimbursed from the proceeds of Special Source Bonds of the County, payable from FILOT payments with respect to the Monster Facility, to be issued not later than twelve (12) months after the payment by the County of such grant monies or from such FILOT payments; (b) the proceeds of such Special Source Bonds; or (c) Special Source Credits, all as shall be agreed to between the County and Monster.

<u>Section 3</u>. Based on the foregoing, the County intends and reasonably expects, to the extent allowed by law, to reimburse itself for expenditures made with respect to the acquisition of real property relative to the Heinz Facility and the Monster Facility from the proceeds of borrowings in the form of a Special Source Bond or Bonds, the interest upon which is exempt from taxation under the Internal Revenue Code of the United States (the "Tax-Exempt Borrowings"). To the extent such borrowings are made, this Resolution shall constitute a declaration of official intent to reimburse under Treasury Regulation Section 1.150-2.

<u>Section 4</u>. It is hereby declared that the maximum principal amount of Tax-Exempt Borrowings from the proceeds of which such expenditures will be reimbursed will be Two Million Four Hundred Seventy-Five Thousand Dollars (\$2,475,000).

<u>Section 5</u>. If any one or more of the provisions of this Resolution should be contrary to law, then such provision shall be deemed severable from the remaining provisions, and shall in no way affect the validity of the other provisions of this Resolution.

ISSUE UNDER CONSIDERATION:

An Ordinance Authorizing And Providing For The Issuance And Sale Of A Not To Exceed \$600,000 General Obligation Bond Of Florence County, South Carolina (Windy Hill/Olanta Rural Volunteer Fire District), Series 2008, Or Such Other Appropriate Series Designation; Fixing The Form And Details Of The Bond; Authorizing The County Administrator To Determine Certain Matters Relating To The Bond; Providing For The Payment Of The Bond And Disposition Of The Proceeds Thereof; And Other Matters Related Thereto.

POINTS TO CONSIDER:

- 1. The Windy Hill/Olanta Rural Volunteer Fire District was created by County Council pursuant to the provisions of Ordinance No. 31-2006/07 adopted on April 5, 2007.
- 2. The Fire District has entered into an agreement with the Town of Olanta to provide fire service inside the municipal boundaries of the Town.
- 3. In order to provide these fire services and house vehicles and equipment, it has become necessary for the Fire District to construct a new fire station. The cost of the station is estimated not to exceed \$600,000.
- 4. Annual debt service on a \$600,000 bond amortized over 20 years at a rate of 5% will be approximately \$48,150.

FUNDING FACTORS:

- 1. The annual debt service of the bond will be funded an approximate 1.5 mill tax levy, which is included in the FY2008/2009 Florence County budget ordinance Ordinance No. 01-2008/09.
- 2. This additional millage will only be levied within the boundaries of the Fire District.

(Authorizing And Providing For The Issuance And Sale Of A Not To Exceed \$600,000 General Obligation Bond Of Florence County, South Carolina (Windy Hill/Olanta Rural Volunteer Fire District), Series 2008, Or Such Other Appropriate Series Designation; Fixing The Form And Details Of The Bond; Authorizing The County Administrator To Determine Certain Matters Relating To The Bond; Providing For The Payment Of The Bond And Disposition Of The Proceeds Thereof; And Other Matters Relating Thereto.)

WHEREAS:

Effective Date

The Windy Hill/Olanta Rural Volunteer Fire District has requested the issuance of a general obligation bond not to exceed \$600,000 for the acquisition of necessary equipment and facilities.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED BY THE FLORENCE COUNTY COUNCIL DULY ASSEMBLED THAT:

<u>SECTION 1. Findings and Determinations.</u> The County Council (the "Council") of Florence County, South Carolina (the "County"), hereby finds and determines:

- (a) Pursuant to Section 4-9-10, Code of Laws of South Carolina, 1976, as amended, the Council-Administrator form of government was adopted and the Council constitutes the governing body of the County.
- (b) Article X, Section 14 of the Constitution of the State of South Carolina, 1895, as amended (the "Constitution"), provides that each county shall have the power to incur bonded indebtedness in such manner and upon such terms and conditions as the General Assembly shall prescribe by general law within the limitations set forth in Section 14 and Section 12 of Article X.
- (c) Article X, Section 12 of the Constitution provides that no law shall be enacted permitting the incurring of bonded indebtedness by any county for fire protection service benefiting only a particular geographical section of the county unless a special assessment, tax or service charge in an amount designed to provide debt service on bonded indebtedness incurred for such purpose shall be imposed upon the area or persons receiving the benefit therefrom.
- (d) Article X, Section 14 of the Constitution further provides that general obligation debt may be incurred only for a purpose which is a public purpose and which is a corporate purpose of the County. The power to incur general obligation debt shall include general obligation debt incurred by the County within the limitations prescribed by Article X, Section 12 of the Constitution.

- (e) In determining the debt limitations imposed by the provisions of Article X, Section 14 of the Constitution, bonded indebtedness incurred pursuant to Article X, Section 12 shall not be considered.
- (f) Pursuant to the provisions of Title 4, Chapter 19 of the Code of Laws of South Carolina, 1976, as amended (the "Act"), the Council has, among other powers, the power: (1) to designate the areas of the County where fire protection service may be furnished by the County under the Act; and (2) to levy and collect ad valorem taxes without limit as to rate or amount upon all taxable property in the service area where fire protection services are furnished to effect the payment of principal and interest on all bonds issued pursuant to the Act or required for the maintenance and operation of the fire protection system.
- (g) In accordance with the provisions of Section 4-19-20 of the Code of Laws of South Carolina, 1976, as amended, and pursuant to the provisions of Ordinance No. 31-2006/07 enacted on April 5, 2007, the County established a special taxing district for the purpose of providing rural fire protection in the County, which includes 106 square miles in the southwestern most corner of the County, such special taxing district being hereinafter referred to as the "Fire District."
- (h) Pursuant to Section 4-19-50 of the Code of Laws of South Carolina, 1976, as amended, the governing body of the County is empowered to issue general obligation bonds of the County, without the necessity of holding an election, for the purpose of purchasing firefighting equipment and to construct, acquire, and build the necessary fire stations and acquire sites for the stations, to provide fire protection in the Fire District.
- (i) Pursuant to this Ordinance, the Council is providing for the levy and collection of an annual ad valorem tax within the Fire District which will be sufficient to provide for the payment of the principal and interest on the Bond (hereinafter described).
- (j) In order to continue to provide fire protection services in the Fire District, the County is undertaking the constructing and equipping of a new fire station (the "Project").
- (k) It is necessary and in the best interest of the County for the Council to provide for the issuance and sale of a not exceeding \$600,000 general obligation bond of the County pursuant to the aforesaid provisions of the Constitution and laws of the State of South Carolina, the proceeds of which will be used: (a) to defray the cost of the Project; (b) to pay costs of issuance of the Bond; and (c) for such other lawful corporate and public purposes as the Council shall determine.

Section 2. Authorizations and Details of Bond. Pursuant to the aforesaid provisions of the Constitution and laws of the State of South Carolina, there is hereby authorized to be issued a general obligation bond of the County in the amount of not exceeding \$600,000 to obtain funds for the purposes mentioned in Section 1(k) above. The bond shall be designated "\$600,000 (or such lesser amount as may be issued) General Obligation Bond (Windy Hill/Olanta Rural Volunteer Fire District), Series 2008, of Florence County, South Carolina (the "Bond")."

The Bond shall be issued as a fully-registered bond; shall be dated the date of its delivery; shall be in the denomination of the amount issued; shall be numbered R-1; shall bear interest at such times as hereafter designated by the Administrator at such rate or rates as may be determined at the time

of the sale thereof; and shall mature serially in successive annual principal installments as determined by the Administrator.

Both the principal of and interest on the Bond shall be payable in any coin or currency of the United States of America which is, at the time of payment, legal tender for public and private debts. The County Treasurer shall serve as the registrar and paying agent (the "Registrar/Paying Agent") for the Bond.

Section 3. Delegation of Authority to Determine Certain Matters Relating to the Bond. The Council hereby delegates to the Administrator the authority to determine (a) the maturity dates of the Bond and the respective principal amounts maturing on such dates; (b) the interest payment dates of the Bond; (c) redemption provisions, if any, for the Bond; and (d) the date and time of sale of the Bond.

The Council hereby further delegates to the Administrator or his designee the authority to receive bids on behalf of the Council and the authority to award the sale of the Bond to the lowest bidder therefor in accordance with the terms of the Notice of Sale for the Bond, provided the true interest cost of the Bond does not exceed six (6%) per annum. After the sale of the Bond, the Administrator shall submit a written report to the Council setting forth the results of the sale of the Bond.

Section 4. Registration, Transfer and Exchange of the Bond. The County shall cause books (herein referred to as the "registry books") to be kept at the offices of the County Treasurer for the registration and transfer of the Bond.

Section 5. Record Date. The County hereby establishes a record date for the payment of interest or for the giving of notice of any proposed redemption of the Bond, and such record date shall be the fifteenth (15th) day (whether or not a business day) preceding an interest payment date on the Bond or, in the case of any proposed redemption of the Bond, such record date shall be the fifteenth (15th) day (whether or not a business day) prior to the mailing of notice of redemption of the Bond.

Section 6. Execution of Bond. The Bond shall be executed in the name of the County with the manual or facsimile signature of the Chairman of the Council attested by the manual or facsimile signature of the Clerk of the Council under a facsimile of the seal of the County which shall be impressed, imprinted or reproduced thereon.

<u>Section 7. Form of Bond</u>. The Bond shall be in substantially the form attached hereto as Exhibit A and incorporated herein by reference.

Section 8. Security for the Bond. For the payment of the principal of and interest on the Bond, as they respectively mature, the full faith, credit and taxing power of Florence County, South Carolina, are hereby irrevocably pledged, and pursuant to Section 4-19-140 of the Code of Laws of South Carolina 1976, as amended and Section 12 of Article X of the Constitution, there shall be levied annually by the Auditor of the County and collected by the Treasurer of the County, in the same manner as other county taxes are levied and collected, an ad valorem tax, without limit, on all taxable property in the Fire District, sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on such Bond as they respectively mature and to create such sinking fund as may be necessary therefor. Bonds issued by the County for the Fire District are the primary obligation of the Fire District and only in the event ad valorem taxes levied and collected in the Fire District are insufficient to pay the debt service on the Bond shall the County be required to levy and collect a tax on all taxable property

within the County sufficient to pay the principal and interest on the Bond as they mature and to create such sinking fund as may be necessary.

The Council shall give the Auditor and Treasurer of the County written notice of the delivery of and payment for the Bond and they are hereby directed to levy and collect annually, on all taxable property in the Fire District, an ad valorem tax sufficient to pay the principal and interest of the Bond as they respectively mature and to create such sinking fund as may be necessary therefor.

<u>Section 9. Notice of Public Hearing</u>. The Council hereby ratifies and approves the publication of a notice of public hearing regarding the Bond and this Ordinance, such notice having been published in the *Morning News* on May 30, 2008.

Section 10. Initiative and Referendum Provisions. The Council hereby delegates to the Administrator the authority to determine whether the Notice prescribed under the provisions of Title 11, Chapter 27 of the Code of Laws of South Carolina 1976 as amended, relating to the initiative and referendum provisions contained in Title 4, Chapter 9, Article 13 of the Code of Laws of South Carolina 1976 as amended, shall be given with respect to this Ordinance. If said Notice is given, the Administrator is authorized to have published in a newspaper of general circulation in the County the notice in substantially the same form as attached hereto as Exhibit B.

<u>Section 11. Defeasance</u>. The obligations of the County under this Ordinance and the pledges, covenants and agreements of the County herein made or provided for, shall be fully discharged and satisfied as to any portion of the Bond, and the Bond shall no longer be deemed to be outstanding hereunder when:

- (a) such Bond shall have been purchased by the County and surrendered to the County for cancellation or otherwise surrendered to the County or the Paying Agent and is canceled or subject to cancellation by the County or the Paying Agent; or
- (b) payment of the principal of and interest on such Bond either (i) shall have been made or caused to be made in accordance with the terms thereof, or (ii) shall have been provided for by irrevocably depositing with the Paying Agent in trust and irrevocably set aside exclusively for such payment (1) moneys sufficient to make such payment or (2) Government Obligations (hereinafter defined) maturing as to principal and interest in such amounts and at such times as will ensure the availability of sufficient moneys to make such payment and all necessary and proper fees, compensation and expenses of the Paying Agent. At such time as the Bond shall no longer be deemed to be outstanding hereunder, such Bond shall cease to draw interest from the due date thereof and, except for the purposes of any such payment from such moneys or Government Obligations as set forth in (ii) above, shall no longer be secured by or entitled to the benefits of this Ordinance.

"Government Obligations" shall mean any of the following:

- (a) direct obligations of the United States of America or agencies thereof or obligations, the payment of principal or interest on which, in the opinion of the Attorney General of the United States, is fully and unconditionally guaranteed by the United States of America; and
- (b) non-callable, U. S. Treasury Securities State and Local Government Series ("SLGS");

- <u>Section 12. Exemption from State Taxes</u>. Both the principal of and interest on the Bond shall be exempt, in accordance with the provisions of Section 12-2-50 of the Code of Laws of South Carolina, 1976, as amended, from all State, county, municipal, school district and all other taxes or assessments, except estate or other transfer taxes, direct or indirect, general or special, whether imposed for the purpose of general revenue or otherwise.
- Section 13. Sale of Bond; Form of Notice of Sale. The Bond shall be offered for public sale on the date and at the time designated by the Administrator. A Notice of Sale shall be distributed to prospective bidders and a summary of such Notice of Sale shall be published in a newspaper of general circulation in the County not less than ten (10) days prior to the date set for such sale.
- Section 14. Filings with Central Repository. In compliance with Section 11-1-85, South Carolina Code of Laws 1976, as amended, the County covenants that it will file or cause to be filed with a central repository for availability in the secondary bond market when requested: (a) a copy of an annual independent audit of the County within thirty (30) days of the County's receipt thereof; and (b) within thirty (30) days of the occurrence thereof, event specific information of an event which adversely affects more than five (5%) percent of the tax revenues of the County or of the County's tax base.
- Section 15. Deposit and Use of Proceeds. The proceeds derived from the sale of the Bonds shall be deposited with the Treasurer of the County in a special fund to the credit of the County, separate and distinct from all other funds, and shall be expended from time to time and made use of by the Council as follows:
- (a) Any premium shall be placed in the sinking fund established pursuant to Section 4-15-150 of the Code of Laws of South Carolina, 1976, as amended; and
- (b) The balance of the proceeds shall be applied for the purposes set forth in this Ordinance including defraying the costs and expenses of issuing the Bonds.
- <u>Section 16. Tax Covenants</u>. The County hereby covenants and agrees with the holders of the Bond that no use of the proceeds of the Bond shall be made which, if such use had been reasonably expected on the date of issue of the Bond would have caused the Bond to be "arbitrage bonds," as defined in Section 148 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 (the "Code"), and to that end the County hereby shall:
- (a) comply with the applicable provisions of Section 103 and Sections 141 through 150 of the Code and any regulations promulgated thereunder so long as the Bond are outstanding;
- (b) establish such funds, make such calculations and pay such amounts, in the manner and at the times required in order to comply with the requirements of the Code relating to required rebates of certain amounts to the United States;
- (c) make such reports of such information at the time and places required by the Code; and
- (d) not take any action which will, or fail to take any action which failure will, cause interest on the Bond to become includable in the gross income of the bondholders for federal income tax purposes pursuant to the provisions of the Code and regulations promulgated thereunder in effect on the date of original issuance of the Bond.

<u>Section 17. Miscellaneous</u>. The Council hereby authorizes the Administrator and the Clerk to Council to execute such documents and instruments as may be necessary to effect the issuance of the Bond. The Council hereby retains the law firm of McNair Law Firm, P.A., as bond counsel in connection with the issuance of the Bond.

All rules, regulations, resolutions and parts thereof, procedural or otherwise, in conflict herewith or the proceedings authorizing the issuance of the Bond are, to the extent of such conflict, hereby repealed and this Ordinance shall take effect and be in full force from and after its enactment.

Section 30.291 entitled "Intent" of the Zoning Ordinance of the Florence County Code establishes that Florence County Council must be satisfied that applications for amendments to the Zoning Atlas of Florence County are not injurious from a public health, safety, and general welfare outlook and the effect of the change will not negatively impact the immediate environs or the County generally; and
- 2. Section 30.297 entitled "Administrative Procedures, Action" of the Zoning Ordinance of the Code of Ordinances for Florence County, South Carolina, republished January 2008, provides a procedure for amending the Official Zoning Map of the County of Florence; and
- 3. The procedure has been followed by the Florence County/Municipal Planning Commission at a public hearing on June 24, 2008.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED BY THE FLORENCE COUNTY COUNCIL DULY ASSEMBLED THAT:

- 1. Properties located on Country Club Drive, Johnsonville bearing Tax Map 00441, Block 5, Parcels 188 and 215 are hereby zoned to R-1, Single-Family Residential District.
- 2. Provisions in other Florence County ordinances in conflict with this Ordinance are hereby repealed.
- 3. If any provision of this Ordinance or the application thereof to any person or circumstance is held invalid, the invalidity does not affect other provisions or applications of the Ordinance which can be given effect without the invalid provision or application and to this end, the provisions of this Ordinance are severable.

Background- The subject properties are requesting zoning to R-1, Single-Family Residential District.


Records indicate that the properties were annexed into the City of Johnsonville in November 1988 and remained unzoned.

ORDINANCE NO. 04-2008/09

COUNCIL-ADMINISTRATOR FORM OF GOVERNMENT FOR FLORENCE COUNTY

(Classifying Facilities Engaged In The Area of Research and Development For The Purposes Of Section 53-1-130 Of The Code Of Laws Of South Carolina, 1976, As Amended, Or To Operations Involving A Customer Service Center And/Or Call Center, And Suspending The Application Of The Work Prohibitions Contained In Chapter 1 Of Title 53 With Respect To Such Facilities Pursuant To Section 53-1-160 Of The Code Of Laws Of South Carolina, 1976, As Amended, And Other Matters Relating Thereto.)

WHEREAS:

- 1. The provisions of Chapter 1 of Title 53 of the Code of Laws of South Carolina, 1976, as amended (the "Code") prohibit the engagement in work, labor, or ordinary business on Sundays prior to 1:30 p.m., subject to numerous exceptions and exemptions; and
- 2. Such exceptions and exemptions include, among other things, research and development operations of any person including the support services necessary for those operations for which the economical operation must engage in a continuous process; and
- 3. Section 53-1-160(A) of the Code also provides that a county governing body may, by ordinance, suspend the application of Sunday work prohibitions contained in Chapter 1 of Title 53 of the Code; and
- 4. Florence County (the "County") is home to numerous businesses engaged in research and development, customer service centers, and call centers, on behalf of themselves and other businesses, which businesses employ hundreds of residents in the County and are an integral part of the County's economy; and
- 5. Officials of the County have been advised that, in light of the current global, e-commerce environment, operations of certain research and development, customer service centers, and call centers, must be carried out continuously to ensure a timely, efficient, and competitive delivery of such services, and thus must take place between midnight and 1:30 p.m. on Sunday; and
- 6. Officials of the County have been advised that research and development centers have heretofore been considered exempt from Sunday work prohibitions of Chapter 1 of Title 53 pursuant to Section 53-1-130 of the Code in that they are involved in research and development; and
- 7. In addition to such exemption, Florence County Council, the governing body of Florence County ("Council"), in order to foster a competitive, pro-business environment in the County by retaining

and attracting research and development, customer service centers, and call centers and the jobs they entail, has determined to provide an express suspension of the application of Sunday work prohibitions contained in Chapter 1 of Title 53 of the Code pursuant to Section 53-1-160(A) of the Code with respect to all research and development, customer service center, and call center facilities in the County; and

8. Council has determined that such a suspension of Sunday work prohibitions contained in Chapter 1 of Title 53 of the Code with respect to research and development, customer service center, and call center facilities is essential to the operation of such facilities in the County; that it will promote a healthy and competitive local economy, preserve existing jobs and encourage the creation of new jobs; and that the operation of such facilities prior to 1:30 p.m. on Sunday is consistent with other express exemptions to Sunday work prohibitions contained in Chapter 1 of Title 53 of the Code and will not impair the policy objectives of Chapter 1 of Title 53 of the Code in light of the existing exemptions set forth above.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED BY THE FLORENCE COUNTY COUNCIL DULY ASSEMBLED THAT:

Article I

Classification and Exemption of Existing Research and Development, Customer Service Center and Call Center Entities

Section 1.01 Classification and Exemption Pursuant to Section 53-1-130 of the Code

All facilities engaged in research and development operations including support services necessary for those operations requiring continuous and uninterrupted operation for which economical operation must engage in a continuous process are hereby classified as facilities exempt from work restrictions on Sunday as set forth in Section 53-1-130 of the Code.

Article II

Suspension of Sunday Work Prohibitions with Respect to Customer Centers and Call Center Facilities

Section 2.01 Suspension of Prohibitions

Pursuant to the authorization contained in Section 53-1-160(A) of the Code, Council by this ordinance suspends the application in the County of the Sunday work prohibitions contained in Chapter 1 of Title 53 of the Code with respect to the operation of all facilities engaged in customer service center or call center entities, either on behalf of the owner of such facility or another business and industry.

Section 2.02 Other Prohibitions to Remain in Effect

All other Sunday work prohibitions not otherwise exempted by statute or previous action of Council shall remain in full force and effect.

Article III Miscellaneous

Section 3.01 Severability

If any provision of this Ordinance shall be deemed unlawful or otherwise ineffective, the remaining provisions of this Ordinance shall remain in full force and effect.

Section 3.02 <u>Time Effective</u>

This Ordinance shall take effect upon third reading.

Florence Regional Arts Alliance requests the use of the former Florence County Public Library for a Holiday Visual Arts Showcase and Sale to be held Thursday, November 20, 2008 through Sunday, November 23, 2008, plus approximately two (2) weeks for set up and takedown time, and for ArtsFest 2009 to be held from Thursday, February 5, 2009 through Sunday, February 8, 2009, plus approximately two (2) weeks for set up and takedown time.

POINTS TO CONSIDER:

- 1. The Regional Arts Alliance has agreed to maintain general liability insurance for the event, naming Florence County as an additional insured, and to indemnify and hold harmless the County. A letter of agreement constituting a temporary conditional lease will be executed prior to allowing the use of the facility.
- 2. The Arts Alliance held ArtsFest 2008 in the former Florence County Public Library building.
- 3. Council permission is required to permit a portion of the facility to be temporarily leased for this limited purpose.

- 1. (Recommended) Approve the temporary use of the former Library by the Arts Alliance for a Holiday Visual Arts Showcase and Sale and ArtsFest 2009 and authorize the County Administrator to execute a temporary letter-form, lease agreement, subject to review by the County Attorney.




