Councilman Schofield seconded the motion, which was approved unanimously.

Councilman Mumford made a motion Council Approve The Recommendation Of The Board Of Trustees Of The Florence Museum Corporation To Appoint Paula Efird To Serve On The Museum Board, Filling A Vacant Seat Representing The Museum Corporation, With Appropriate Expiration Term. Councilman Dorriety seconded the motion, which was approved unanimously.

REPORTS TO COUNCIL:

ADMINISTRATION

ADMINISTRATOR'S REPORT

County Administrator K. G. Rusty Smith, Jr. Mated that Council was provided with a comprehensive update on the Capital Project Sales Tax I (CPST I) and Capital Project Sales Tax II (CPST II), as well as the most recent report from the very informative monthly department heads meeting.

After much ado, the County extended its global reach by going LIVE with its new ON-LINE employment application system. Prospective job applicants could visit the County's website at www.florenceco.org to view this new feature and apply for County positions. This proactive measure had already proven to be prudent by streamlining the process for applicants, as well as staff, and also maximized potential in the recruitment of qualified personnel.

Florence County had completed 257 roads in its CPST II Quest. Also had 7 roads under contract and Council was asked to approve 20 more roads at the meeting. In Section XII: 7 of the 9 roads had been completed. Moulds and Law Roads were under construction. Moulds Road required additional improvements and a change order was being executed to Wade Lott for the necessary quantities to complete the project. Even with the \$116,000 change order the project came in substantially under the budget of \$1.1 million at \$381,000, so a total savings realized of \$700,000 to \$800,000.

Most other projects were proceeding nicely with the municipal projects beginning to pick up steam: projects underway in Johnsonville, Coward, Olanta, Pamplico, Lake City, Florence and Quinby.

The County continued to wage its "Getting Bitter against Litter" campaign. Mr. Smith stated the following factual statistics were amazing: since May 1st the County picked up 1,945 bags of trash, 104 tires, 31,671 pounds of litter, wrote 54 citations, collected \$17,221.75 in fines and cleaned 78.1 miles of road. He said this was quite phenomenal and thanked Herbie Christmas and the staff at Environmental Services, Carlie Gregg, SCDNR and the Sheriff's Department for their helpful collaboration. SCDNR and the Sheriff's office had also written citations for other type criminal offenses, so this effort was having a far-reaching effect. The Palmer program was working extremely well.

He stated that while he was espousing good news, he also wanted to note that in an effort to maximize savings, the County had reduced waste tire disposal costs by two-thirds. In 2014 the cost for recycle and disposal of tires was \$115,000.00. Through cooperation and collaboration the County had consistently reduced that figure in FY16 to \$33,000. Thanks to Carlie, Kathy and VIVA Recycling for a job well done.

Also on a positive note, Councilman Kirby had one of his constituents, Mr. Darrell J. McFadden, appear before Council on March 17, 2016 to request the deployment of fire extinguishers in County first response vehicles. Mr. Smith stated that thanks to Mr. Kirby and Council's directive, staff was able to attain 3 grants totaling \$2,500 from the Walmart Foundation, which would be used to install 53 fire extinguishers in Sheriff's department vehicles and provide the necessary training to the County's outstanding deputies. There were 106 vehicle fires in Florence County last year and this surely would enhance the County's ability to limit loss of life and property. He expressed appreciation to Kathy Nephew, Sam Brockington, Billy Dillon and the Sheriff's Department for collaborating on this worthwhile endeavor.

He stated the County also continued its health initiative through its Heart Savers Program. He commended Kathr again for obtaining a grant from Hopey's Heart Foundation. Hopey's, a leader in the fight against sudden cardiac arrest deaths, had provided an award in the form of an AED or Automated External Defibrillator to our Parks & Recreation Department. The AED with cabinet was installed at Greenwood Athletic Park which was home to a multitude of children playing ball. Given the numbers who utilize the park the chance of cardiac arrest was ever present and this unit could restore a normal heart rhythm to a victim to sustain life. He expressed thanks to Ryon, Ronnie, Tony, Kevin, and Kathy for collaborating to provide yet another link in the chain of survival.

Also of note, the South Carolina General Assembly provided additional "recurring" funding to the 12th Judicial Circuit Public Defender's and Solicitor's Offices. Mr. Scott Floyd advised that he would be adding 3 full-time public defender positions and Jack Greenan said the Solicitor's Office would hire 3 new assistant solicitors and one paralegal. This initiative was an exercise in caseload reduction and Florence County accepts no fiduciary responsibility for their employment. No action was required by Council.

Mr. Smith stated some members of Council were in receipt of a request from citizens of District 9 to halt the City of Florence from annexing a portion of property off Meadors Road. Mr. McEachin briefly reviewed the situation and if Council so desired he could prepare a recommendation and response to the City's annexation attempt. He stated hearing no objection, he would have Mr. McEachin look into the matter further and send an appropriate response.

MONTHLY FINANCIAL REPORTS

Mr. Smith stated that Monthly Financial Reports Were Provided To Council For Fiscal Year 2016 Through May 31, 2016 For Council's elucidation.

2016 PROPOSED CALENDAR REVISION

Councilman Caudle made a motion Council Approve The Revised 2016 Calendar Of Meeting Dates And Holidays To Change The Date Of The September 15th Regular Meeting To September 22nd. Councilman Springs seconded the motion, which was approved unanimously.

Councilman Caudle made a motion Council Authorize The County Administrator To Execute An Easement To Duke Energy Progress, Inc. In Order To Relocate Electrical Lines At The New Judicial Center Site. Councilman Springs seconded the motion, which was approved unanimously.

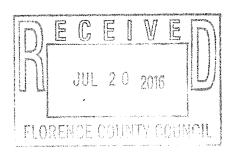

STAFF ANALYSIS:

History

The General Commercial District (B-3) was recently designated on this parcel. This zoning was finalized at the Florence County Council meeting in January, 2016. Before this zoning change, the parcel was previously zoned Rural Community District (RU-1) and General Commercial District (B-3). This zoning reflects the original zoning of the parcel with the Zoning Ordinance

and Maps from the early 1990's, prior to the consolidation of Municipal and County Planning Departments. The approximate acreage for B-3 was 4.67, the remaining zoned RU-1.

Existing and Proposed Zoning:

The subject parcel currently has a commercial structure on the front portion with the remaining portion vacant and currently zoned General Commercial District (B-3). The parcel is contiguous to Rural Community District (RU-1) and General Commercial District (B-3). The applicant has requested a map amendment to Planned Development District (PD).

The General Commercial District (B-3) purpose is to provide for areas where large scale commercial and business development may take place. This district permits a wide range of business, commercial and residential uses.

The purpose of the Planned Development District is to encourage flexibility in the development of land in order to promote its most appropriate use; and to do so in a manner that will enhance public health, safety, morals and general welfare of the community. As a building development, it is designed to group both varied and compatible land uses, such as housing, recreation and commercial uses, all within one contained development or subdivision.

Traffic Review:

Present access to the parcel is by way of West Palmetto Street. The map amendment for this parcel could have a minimal effect on traffic flow in the area.

Within the PD, regulations adapted to unified planning and development are intended to accomplish the purpose of zoning and other applicable regulations to an equivalent or higher degree than where such regulations are designed to control unscheduled development on individual lots or tracts, promote economical and efficient land use, provide an improved level of

amenities, foster a harmonious variety of uses, encourage creative design, and produce a better environment.

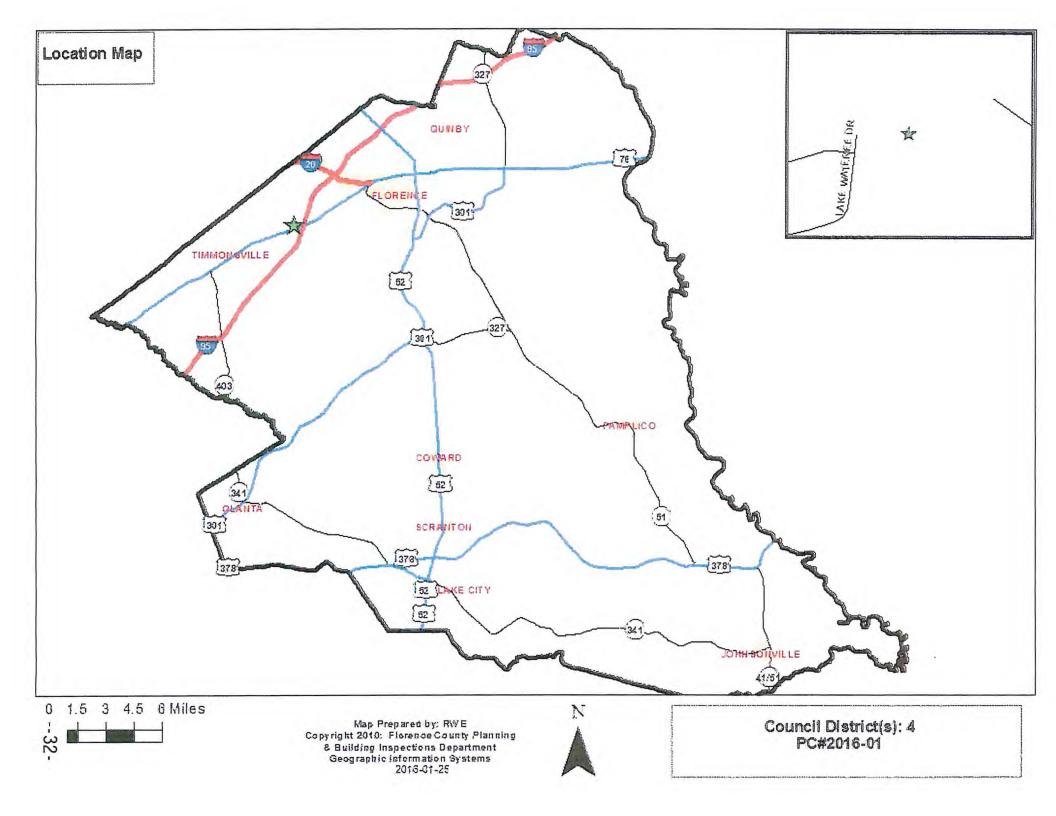

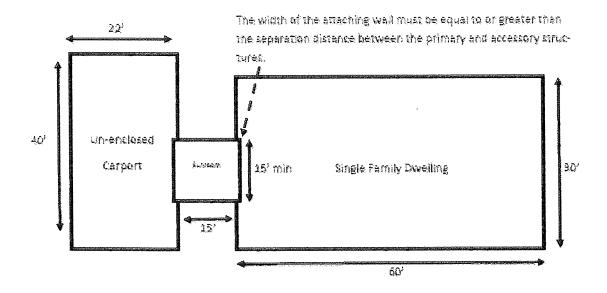

Staff Analysis:

Periodically, the State of South Carolina adopts, by reference and amendment, the latest editions of the following nationally recognized codes and the standards referenced in those codes, for regulation of construction within this State: International Building Code®, International Existing Building Code®, International Residential Code®, International Plumbing Code®, International Mechanical Code®, International Fuel Gas Code®, International Fire Code®, International Energy Conservation Code®, and the National Electric Code®. The International Codes are promulgated, published or made available by the International Code Council, Inc. and the National Electrical Code is published by the National Fire Protection Association. These codes are referenced in the South Carolina Code of Laws, Title 6, Chapter 9, Section 6-9-50.

The South Carolina Code of Laws directs that all municipalities and counties in this State shall enforce the latest editions of the Building, Residential, Plumbing, Mechanical, Fuel Gas, Fire, Energy Conservation and Electric codes relating to the construction, livability, sanitation, erection, energy efficiency, installation of equipment, alteration, repair, occupancy, classification, or removal of enforcement. The municipality or county shall enforce only the national building and safety codes provided in the South Carolina Code of Laws.

The State of South Carolina, consistent with the aforementioned requirements, adopted the 2015 International Building Code® series, the 2014 edition of the National Electrical Code® and the 2009 International Energy Conservation Code® with an effective date of July 2016.

Therefore, Compliance with the SC Code of Laws requires The Florence County Code of Ordinances, Chapter 7 – BUILDING REGULATIONS, ARTICLE II – STANDARDS FOR CONSTRUCTION, INSTALLATIONS AND MAINTENANCE, DIVISION 1 – GENERALLY, Sec. 7-11 – Building code administration, be amended to read as follows:

ORDINANCE NO. 36-2015/16

COUNCIL-ADMINISTRATOR FORM OF GOVERNMENT FOR FLORENCE COUNTY

AN ORDINANCE

AUTHORIZING THE AWARD, EXECUTION, AND DELIVERY OF A LEASE PURCHASE AGREEMENT BY FLORENCE COUNTY, SOUTH CAROLINA IN A PRINCIPAL AMOUNT OF NOT EXCEEDING \$500,000, RELATING TO LIGHTING FOR THE JOHNSONVILLE ATHLETIC COMPLEX; AUTHORIZING THE EXECUTION OF OTHER NECESSARY DOCUMENTS AND PAPERS; AND OTHER MATTERS RELATING THERETO.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Florence County Council, the governing body of Florence County, South Carolina, in meeting duly assembled:

ARTICLE I FINDINGS OF FACT

Florence County Council (the "County Council"), the governing body of Florence County, South Carolina (the "County"), has made the following findings of fact:

Section 1.01

The County Council has determined that a very real need exists for and that it is necessary for the County to acquire certain lighting for the Johnsonville Athletic Complex, including items of equipment (collectively, the "Equipment"), the installation and use of which will result in the efficient and expanded use of the Johnsonville Athletic Complex. The Equipment is more fully described and identified in the Lease (as hereinafter defined and as attached in form hereto as <u>Exhibit "A"</u>).

The cost of the Equipment to be provided is estimated to be not exceeding \$545,000. The County Council has determined after due investigation that it is in the best interests of the County to finance the purchase of the Equipment through a Lease with Option to Purchase Agreement in accordance with the terms of this Ordinance. The County Council has determined that the lighting as provided in the Lease will expand the use of the Johnsonville Athletic Complex by the public.

ARTICLMII <u>AUTHORIZATION</u>

Section 2.01 Approval of the Performance Contract.

As described in the recitals to this Ordinance, the County has solicited proposals from various providers of athletic field lighting and has determined that Musco is the sole source designer and manufacturer of the control-link automated controls product and therefore is the sole source provider of the lighting desired. Accordingly, the County Council hereby determines that Musco shall be selected as the vendor of the lighting and thus of the Equipment.

Section 2.02 Approval of the Financing.

The County Council hereby further approves the entry by the County into a Lease in principal amount not to exceed \$500,000 (the "Agreement") to finance the purchase of the Equipment. The Agreement will bear interest at a rate that will not exceed 3.00% for a period of 7 years. It is further provided that the initial down payment of \$54,500.00 will come from Capital Project Sales Tax II funds and the first payment on the Lease will not be due until August, 2017. The Agreement shall be payable at such times and in such amounts as set forth herein, and shall contain such terms as shall be approved by the County Administrator of the County (the "County Administrator") with the advice of the County's Finance Director and legal counsel.

The Agreement shall not constitute a debt of the County, and the full faith, credit, and taxing power of the County shall not be pledged to secure payment of rental payments or other sums due pursuant to the Agreement.

The County Administrator is hereby authorized to solicit proposals from various financial institutions for the financing of the Equipment and to select such institution offering the most favorable terms to the County as the financing counterparty.

Section 2.03 Authorization to Contract.

The County Administrator is hereby authorized, empowered, and directed to execute, acknowledge, and deliver the Performance Contract, the Agreement, and all necessary or associated documents to the selected financial institution under the Agreement, and other appropriate parties.

The execution of the Lease by the County Administrator shall constitute conclusive evidence of approval of the terms and conditions of the Lease, the amount thereof, and the Equipment to be delivered pursuant to the Lease.

The form of the Agreement shall be as agreed to by the County Administrator, in consultation with the County's legal counsel, and the lending institution selected by the counterparty under the Agreement, provided that the amount of principal advanced under the Agreement shall not exceed \$500,000.

Section 2.04 Other Documents.

The County Administrator is hereby authorized to take such actions and to execute any and all other documents, instruments, certificates, or other papers, each consistent with the terms of this Ordinance, as he deems necessary and appropriate, with the advice of coursel, to accomplish the transactions contemplated by this Ordinance.

Section 2.05 Repealer.

All prior Ordinances and other actions of the County and any portions thereof conflicting with the terms of this Ordinance are hereby repealed.

Section 2.06 Effective Date of Ordinance.

This Ordinance shall become effective upon the adoption thereof.

ARTICLE III CERTAIN MATTERS PERTAINING TO THE INTERNAL REVENUE CODE

Section 3.01 General Tax Covenants.

The County will comply with all requirements of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended (the "Code"), in order to preserve the tax-exempt status of the Agreement including, without limitation, the requirement to file the information report pertaining to the Agreement with the Internal Revenue Service.

Section 3.02 General Tax Representations and Covenants.

The County hereby represents and covenants that it will not take any action which will, or fail to take any action which failure will, cause the interest component of rental payments made pursuant to the Agreement to become includable in the gross income of the Holder thereof for federal income tax purposes pursuant to the provisions of the Code and regulations promulgated thereunder in effect on the date of original execution of the Agreement. Without limiting the generality of the foregoing, the County represents and covenants that:

- (a) All property provided by the net proceeds of the Agreement will be owned by the County in accordance with the rules governing the ownership of property for federal income tax purposes.
- (b) The County shall not permit the proceeds of the Agreement or any facility financed with the proceeds of the Agreement to be used in any manner that would result in (a) ten percent (10%) or more of such proceeds being considered as having been used directly or indirectly in any trade or business carried on by any natural person or in any activity carried on by a person other than a natural person other than a governmental unit as provided in Section 141(b) of the Code, or (b) five percent (5%) or more of such proceeds being considered as having been used directly or indirectly to make or finance loans to any person other than a governmental unit as provided in Section 141(c) of the Code.
- (c) The County is not a party to or nor will it enter into any contracts with any person for the use or management of any facility provided with the proceeds of the Agreement that do not conform to the guidelines set forth in Revenue Procedure 97-13, as may be raddified by subsequent pronouncements of the United States Treasury Department applicable thereto.
- (d) The County will not sell or lease the Equipment or any property provided by the Agreement to any person unless it obtains the opinion of nationally recognized bond counsel that such lease or sale will not affect the tax exemption of the Agreement
- (e) The Agreement will not be federally guaranteed within the meaning of Section 149(b) of the Code. The County has not entered into any leases or sales or service contract with any federal government agency and will not enter into any such leases or contracts unless it obtains the opinion of nationally recognized bond counsel that such action will not affect the tax exemption of the Agreement.
- (f) No portion of the proceeds of the Agreement will be used as a substitute for other funds which were otherwise to be used to pay the costs of the Equipment. The County Council has determined, based on its own investigations and reasonable expectations and a certificate delivered by Musco, that the weighted average maturity of the Agreement does not exceed 120% of the reasonably expected economic life of the Equipment.

COUNCIL-ADMINISTRATOR FORM OF GOVERNMENT FOR FLORENCE COUNTY

[An Ordinance Authorizing An Amendment To The Fee-In-Lieu Of Ad Valorem Taxes Agreement Between Florence County, South Carolina And Mccall Farms, Inc. To Provide For The Inclusion Of A Proposed Expansion In The Fee-In-Lieu Of Ad Valorem Taxes Agreement, The Extension Of The Term Thereof, The Provision Of Enhanced Special Source Revenue Credits Thereunder, And Other Matters Related Thereto.]

WHEREAS:

- 1. Florence County, South Carolina (the "County"), acting by and through its County Council (the "County Council"), is authorized and empowered under and pursuant to the provisions of Title 12, Chapter 44 of the Code of Laws of South Carolina, 1976, as amended (the "Act") to enter into a fee in lieu of tax ("FILOT") agreement with companies meeting the requirements of the Act; and
- 2. Pursuant to the Act, and in order to induce certain investments in the County, the County entered into a Fee-in-Lieu of Ad Valorem Taxes Agreement with McCall Farms, Inc. (the "Company"), providing for a FILOT incentive and certain special source revenue credits ("SSRCs") (the "Fee Agreement"); and
- 3. Under the Fee Agreement and in consideration of the FILOT and SSRC incentives offered thereby, the Company undertook an investment of approximately \$10,000,000 in order to expand its facilities in the County, and the Company has instead invested over \$49,000,000 in its facilities in the County within the Investment Period (as the Fee Agreement defines such term); and
- 4. The Company is considering an additional investment in the County of approximately \$23,331,000 over the next five years that is anticipated to create 150 new, full-time jobs over and above the Company's current employment base of 500 jobs in the County (the "Project"), and the Company has requested that the County amend the Fee Agreement in order to provide enhanced benefits that will apply to the additional investment; and
- 5. The Company has caused to be prepared and presented to the County the form of an Amendment to Fee Agreement (the "Amendment") providing for an extension of the term of

- the Fee Agreement, the provision of enhanced SSRCs under the Fee Agreement, and other matters related thereto; and
- 6. It appears that the Amendment, now before this meeting, is in appropriate form and is an appropriate instrument to be approved, executed, and delivered by the County for the purposes intended.
- **NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED**, by the Governing Body of Florence County, the Florence County Council, as follows:
- Section 1. It is hereby found, determined, and declared by the County Council as follows:
 - (a) The Project constitutes a "project" as defined in the Act and will constitute "economic development property" as said term is referred to and defined in the Act, and the County's actions herein will serve the purposes and in all respects conform to the provisions and requirements of the Act;
 - (b) The Project will benefit the general public welfare of the County by providing services, employment, and other public benefits not otherwise provided locally;
 - (c) The Project will give rise to no pecuniary liability of the County or any incorporated municipality or a charge against the general credit or taxing power of either;
 - (d) The inducement of the location of the Project within the County and the State is of paramount importance;
 - (e) The purposes to be accomplished by the Project, i.e., economic development, retention of jobs, and addition to the tax base of the County, are proper governmental and public purposes, and the benefits of the Project are greater than the costs; and
 - (f) Having evaluated the purposes to be accomplished by the Project as proper governmental and public purposes, the anticipated dollar amount and nature of the investment to be made, and the anticipated costs and benefits to the County, the County has determined that the Project is properly classified as economic development property.
- Section 2. The forms, terms, and provisions of the Amendment presented to this meeting are hereby approved, and all of the terms and provisions thereof are hereby incorporated herein by reference as if the Amendment were set out in this Ordinance in its entirety. The Chairman of the County Council and County Administrator are each hereby authorized, empowered, and directed to execute, acknowledge, and deliver the Amendment in the name of and on behalf of the County, and thereupon to cause the Amendment to be delivered to the Company and cause a copy of the Amendment to be delivered to the Florence County Auditor and Assessor. The Amendment is to be in substantially the form now before this meeting and hereby approved, or with such minor changes therein as shall be approved by the officials of the

County executing the same, their execution thereof to constitute conclusive evidence of their approval of any and all changes or revisions therein from the form of the Amendment now before this meeting.

Section 3. The Chairman of the County Council, the County Administrator, and the Clerk to County Council, for and on behalf of the County, are hereby authorized and directed to do any and all things necessary to effect the execution and delivery of the Amendment and the performance of all obligations of the County under and pursuant to the Amendment.

Section 4. The provision of this Ordinance are hereby declared to be separable and if any section, phrase, or provision shall for any reason be declared by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid or unenforceable, such declaration shall not affect the validity of the remainder of the sections, phrases, and provisions hereunder.

<u>Section 5</u>. All ordinances, resolutions, and parts thereof in conflict herewith are, to the extent of such conflict, hereby repealed. This Ordinance shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage by the County Council.

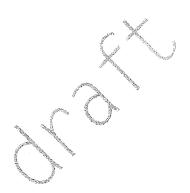

AMENDMENT TO FEE AGREEMENT

This Amendment (the "Amendment") to the Fee-in-Lieu of Taxes Agreement (the "Fee Agreement") by and between FLORENCE COUNTY, SOUTH CAROLINA (the "County") and MCCALL FARMS, INC. (the "Company"), is made and entered into this ____ day of _____, 2016.

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the County, acting by and through its County Council (the "County Council"), is authorized and empowered under and pursuant to the provisions of Title 12, Chapter 44 of the Code of Laws of South Carolina, 1976, as amended (the "Act") to enter into a fee agreement with companies meeting the requirements of the Act; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Act, and in order to induce certain investments in the County, the County entered into a Fee-in-Lieu of Ad Valorem Taxes Agreement with McCall Farms, Inc. (the "Company") providing for a fee-in-lieu of tax ("FILOT") incentive and providing for certain special source revenue credits ("SSRCs") (the "Fee Agreement"); and

WHEREAS, under the Fee Agreement and in consideration of the FILOT and SSRC incentives offered thereby, the Company undertook an investment of approximately \$10,000,000 in order to expand its facilities in the County, and the Company has instead invested over \$49,000,000 in its facilities in the County within the Initial Investment Period (as the Fee Agreement defines such term); and

WHEREAS, the Company is considering an additional investment in the County of approximately \$23,331,000 over the next five years that is anticipated to create 150 new, full-time jobs over and above the Company's current employment base of 500 jobs in the County (the "Project"), and the Company has requested that the County amend the Fee Agreement in order to provide enhanced benefits that will apply to the additional investment; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to an Ordinance of the County Council of even date herewith, the County Council has approved the execution of this Amendment.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the foregoing and other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which is hereby acknowledged, the County and the Company agree as follows:

- 1. The Project shall be eligible for the benefits provided under and shall be included as part of the Fee Agreement, subject to the terms and conditions stated therein.
- 2. Section 1.1 of the Fee Agreement is amended to replace the definition of "Phase Termination Date" and insert the following definition in its place:

"Phase Termination Date" means with respect to each Phase of the Project the day forty years after each such Phase of the Project becomes subject to the terms of this Fee Agreement.

Anything contained herein to the contrary notwithstanding, the last Phase Termination Date shall be no later than December 31 of the year of the expiration of the maximum period of years that the annual fee payment is available to the Company under Section 12-44-30(21) of the Act, as amended.

The Fee Agreement is further amended to revise all additional references to the period of time in which the FILOT incentive remains in place to reflect the forty-year period as provided above.

3. Section 3.1(a) of the Fee Agreement is amended to replace the last sentence and insert the following sentence in its place:

The Company having satisfied the statutory minimum investment within the Initial Investment Period, the total investment period is extended through and including December 31, 2020.

- 4. Section 3.1(b) is amended to remove Step 4 and insert the following language in its place:
- Step 4: As authorized under Sections 4-1-175, 4-29-68, and 12-44-70 of the Code, the Company is entitled to claim a 25% Special Source Revenue Credit against that portion of each of the first five FILOT Payments due with respect to the investment and a 40% Special Source Revenue Credit against that portion of each of the following fifteen FILOT Payment due with respect to the investment (each a "Credit"). The additional 15% Credit in years 6-20 shall be referred to as the "Enhanced Credit."
 - 5. Section 3.1(e) is hereby inserted into the Fee Agreement and shall read as follows:

If the Company has not reached and maintained an investment in the Project of at least \$23,331,000 and reached and maintained total employment of 650 full-time jobs in the County as of December 31, 2020, the Enhanced Credits shall be reduced by the Average Percentage Shortfall, calculated as follows:

Average Percentage Shortfall = 100% - Overall Achievement Percentage

Overall Achievement Percentage = (Investment Achievement Percentage + Jobs Achievement Percentage) / 2

Investment Achievement Percentage = Company's capital investment from January 1, 2016 to December 31, 2020 / \$23,331,000

Jobs Achievement Percentage = (Number of Company's full-time jobs in the County as of December 31, 2020 - 500) / 150.

For instance, if the Company has invested and maintained \$20,997,900 (90% of \$23,331,000) between January 1, 2016 and December 31, 2010 and maintained 620 full-time

jobs as of December 31, 2020, the Investment Achievement Percentage would be 90% (\$20,997,900/\$23,331,000 = 90%), the Jobs Achievement Percentage would be 80% ((620-500)/150) = 120/150 = 80%), and the Overall Achievement Percentage would be 85%. The Average Percentage Shortfall would be 15%, and the Company would repay to the County 15% of the Enhanced Credits claimed to date.

In any year subsequent to 2020, the Enhanced Credits shall be reduced proportionately in the same manner on a year-by-year basis, based on the investment (originally placed in service between January 1, 2016 and December 31, 2020) and full-time jobs maintained as of December 31 of the immediately preceding year. The Company's investment in the Project shall be measured by its original cost, without regard to depreciation.

In the event that the Company ceases to operate the Project on or before December 31, 2031, the Enhanced Credits shall cease, and the Company shall be obligated to repay a prorated portion of the Enhanced Credits previously claimed, with such prorated portion equal to [(15 – the number of full years in which the Project has been in service at the time of the cessation of operations) / 15]. For example, and by way of example only, if the Company ceases to operate the Project after the Project has been in service for 12 years, the Company would be obligated to repay 3/15 (20%) of the Enhanced Credits.

Any amounts due to the County under this Section 3.1(e) shall be paid within 90 days following written notice thereof from the County to the Company.

6. Except as otherwise provided herein the Fee Agreement shall remain in full force and effect.

1. GENERAL

The Pro-Patch is a unitized asphalt repair machine capable of making permanent asphalt repairs under most weather conditions.

2. BODY DIMENSIONS

For dimensions, refer to list of available models. Body has Diamond Tread safety step side fenders with two ladders, body assist handles. Body has extra large stop, turn, emergency flashers with dual element integral lighting. The body has a lockable tool storage compartment measuring 83" long, 18" deep and 10" high. MUD FLAPS INCLUDED.

3. BODY INSULATION

The asphalt aggregate hopper and road oil tank are fully insulated with 2" industrial, high temperature 12R factor insulation encased in a double steel jacket. The top cover on the unit is an Optional double form fitted 2" insulated tarp with tie down brackets, capable of sustaining 500° F., OR Optional Hydraulic Operated Steel Top Doors.

4. CAPACITY

Hopper capacity, depending on model, will be 4.25, 5 or 6 cubic yards.

5. HEATING SYSTEMS

The body shall have a dry radiant heat chamber heated by 2 each 150,000 BTU retort tube

propane burners with vertical exhaust stacks. Exhaust stacks have an automatic electronic dampener that opens when burners are fired and close when burners shut off to prevent heat loss. The burners are thermostat controlled and regulated at 10 PSI. The ignition system is 12 volt DC with electronic ignitor. Gas burner has a safety shut-off on loss of flame or excessive temperature. Automatic safety shut-off when diesel pump is operating. Burner has two stages, ignites on 5 oz. pressure, operates at 10 PSI, on high burn regulated by the same thermostat as the electric heater. Thermostats will be 0/300° F. solid state.

6. ELECTRONIC CONTROLS

All electronic controls will be solid state shock resistant. Thermostat for tack oil tank is 50/200°F. Thermostat for asphalt aggregate hopper is 0/300° F. Thermostat for the asphalt hopper has built in high limit safety shut down switch. Same thermostat controls the 12 volt LP Gas fired system and the 220 volt electric heating system.

7. EMULSION OIL TANK CAPACITY AND HEATING SYSTEM

For capacity, refer to list of models available. The tank has a double steel jacket with 2" insulation. The tank is equipped with a heat transfer system with an adjustable temperature valve that is capable of heating the emulsion oil from 0 to 150° F., using the truck engine coolant system as the heat source. The emulsion pump and all lines are in an insulated heated area. The tank has 220 voit thermostat controlled NEMA explosion proof dry well electric heater and a hot well for storing the spray wand in cold weather. Tank has an 8" fill spout and a 2" gate valve on tank drain. For ease of maintenance or change out of heater, tank does not have to be drained.

8. ELECTRIC HEATING SYSTEM

The asphalt aggregate hopper and liquid asphalt oil tank is heated by a 220 volt, 62 kw OSHA required NEMA explosion proof dry well electric heater, thermostat controlled with 25' of cord with dual in-line 30 amp fuses with MOV 220 VAC surge absorber. The heating system is capable of maintaining heated material up to 300° F. during non-working hours.

9. FUEL

Optional 35 or 50 galion frame mounted LP gas bottle with quick fill connector, 10 psi regulator and fuel sight gauge OR Optional 100 lb (25 gallon) removable propane bottle, complete with 10 PSI regulator.

10. TEMPERATURE GAUGES

The unit has two 3" dial type, stainless steel temperature gauges that constantly monitor the temperature of the asphalt hopper and road oil tank.

11. HAND TORCH

For drying off repair site and cleaning hand tools, the unit has a 200,000 propane BTU hand torch with shut-off valve and 10' of hose with hose rack. Hand torch has mounting bracket for transport.

12. LIOUID ASPHALT OIL PUMP

A hydraulically driven, 1 1/2" self priming, variable speed, reversible, rotary gear pump with relief valve. Operating at 20 GPM at 1200 RPM, 100 PSI. The emulsion pump and all oil lines are in an insulated heated area. The pump will circulate the emulsion oil to prevent separation and to crush any lumps that may form and cause clogging of the spray tip. Air injection systems do not have this capability.

13. PAVEMENT BREAKER

We offer optional; Stanley BR45, 67 and 87 Pavement Breakers, complete with quick couplers, asphalt cutter, tamper and detachable shank with lockable transporting bracket.

14. LIQUID ASPHALT HAND SPRAYER

A $5' \times 3/8"$ wand, equipped with fan nozzle and Deadman Control Valve. Sprayer hose is $15' \times 1/2"$ with a reversible pump and diesel flush system for cleaning pump and lines.

15. HYDRAULIC PUMP

The pump is gear type, variable speed at 12 GPM and has an operating pressure of 2000 PSI at 900 RPM.

16. HYDRAULIC OIL RESERVOIR

30 gallon capacity with sight and temperature gauge, ventilated fill cap, 150 micron sump strainer and a 10 micron return filler.

17. HYDRAULIC OIL COOLER

An AKG 15 tube hydraulic oil cooler with shroud. The fan cooler operates on 12 volt DC and is thermostat controlled at 115° F.

18. HYDRAULIC HOSE AND FITTINGS

All high pressure hoses and crimped fittings have a minimum of 9600 PSI burst pressure.

19. HYDRAULIC CONTROL VALVE

Five spool, two way, variable flow with 2200 PSI relief valve. The valve controls hydraulic screw conveyor, hydraulic doors, asphalt agitator, liquid asphalt pump and tool circuit. The valve has an internal or external safety design will protect the operator and not allow the screw conveyor or asphalt agitator to operate when the doors are open. This system is designed to divert hydraulic oil pressure back to the tank. Electronic solenoids on hydraulic valve are not acceptable due to mechanical override feature and ease of bypassing system. The valve is operated from the rear of machine by remote levers. To reduce maintenance problems the main directional control valve stack has no electric solenoids.

20. SCREW CONVEYOR

10' long by 6" diameter progressive screw conveyor has hard surfaced flights welded continuously on 2" scheduled 80 pipe and is ball bearing mounted. Conveyor is driven by a 9200 in.lb. torque variable speed hydraulic motor with forward and reverse. Shall have a delivery chute with 120° of pivot. All bearings can be greased from ground level.

21. ASPHALT AGITATOR

The agitator shaft is built into the premix hopper and designed to break up asphalt bridging due to vibratory compaction. The scheduled 160 shaft has 12 spikes and is ball bearing mounted and driven by a 9200 in.lb. torque variable speed hydraulic motor with forward and reverse. All bearings can be greased from ground level.

22. P.T.O

A Muncie or Chelsea Hot Shift or Electric Over Air Shift, depending on truck transmission model.

23. ELECTRONIC THROTTLE CONTROL

A two (2) or three (3) speed, depending on application, rear mounted remote switch allows operator more control over which speed and pressure each particular job requires. As a safety feature, the switch will not function unless the park brake is set on the vehicle.

24. DIESEL / RELEASING AGENT STORAGE TANK

An 18 gallon capacity tank, equipped with a 12 volt DC pump and a hand sprayer for cleaning tools and unit. There shall be a connector valve for flushing road oil pump and lines and a 1" drain. For easy hopper cleaning access and to spray hopper before loading, units with a work deck shall have an additional front mounted spray wand with 3 ft. of hose.

25, COLOR

Customer's option, standard color is Gloss Black.

26. OPTIONAL WORK DECK

The optional Work Deck shall be constructed of 1/4" angle iron and 3/16" expanded metal with assist hand rails and shall be mounted between hopper and truck cab.
